- ☐ The British Museum Home to a vast collection of world art and artifacts, including the Rosetta Stone.
- ☐ The London Eye A giant Ferris wheel offering panoramic views of the city.
- ☐ Buckingham Palace The official residence of the British monarch, known for the Changing of the Guard ceremony.
- ☐ The Tower of London historic castle famous for its role in British history and its crown jewels.

Edinburgh
